I hereby find and declare that a majority of the freeholders and qualified voters in paid county, voting at said election, voted for said proposition and that after the expiration of thirty days from the issuance of this proclamation it shall be unlawful to permit to run tlarge in this county, horses, mules, jacks, and cattle.

A copy of this proclamation shall be posted at the courthouse door of this county as proided by law.
