SCOPE OF WORK: Burnet County is seeking bids for the replacement/installation of roofs for the Burnet County AgriLife building located at 607 N. Vanderveer and for the Herman Brown Free Library located at 100 E. Washington St., in accordance to the attached Exhibit A – Summary of Work.

EXAMINATION OF EXISTING PREMISES: It is understood and agreed that the Contractor has by careful examination, satisfied himself as to the nature and location of the work, the character and quality of the materials to be encountered, the character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the prosecution of the work, the general and local conditions, and all other matters which can in any way affect the work under this contract. No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer, agent, or employee of the Owner, either before or after the execution of this contract, shall affect or modify any of the terms or obligations herein contained. The bid shall be based on the specifications, supplemented by the affecting conditions **RISK:** The work under this contract in every respect shall be at the risk of the Contractor until finished and accepted.

EXECUTION, CORRECTION, AND INTENT OF: The Contractor acknowledges and declares that it has visited and examined the site and reasonably examined the physical and other conditions affecting the work. In connection therewith, Contractor specifically, will represent to Owner that to its best knowledge and belief it has, by careful examination, satisfied itself as to: (1) the nature, location, and character of the Project and the site, excluding subsurface and latent conditions; (2) the nature, location, and character of the general area in which the Project is located; and (3) the quality and quantity of all materials, supplies, tools, equipment, labor, necessary to complete the Work in the manner and within the cost and time frame required by the Contract Documents. In arriving at the Contract Sum and the Contract Time, Contractor has, as an experienced and prudent manager and contractor, exercised its reasonable judgment and expertise to include the impact of such circumstances upon the Contract Sum and the Contract Time. Claims for additional compensation or time because of the failure of the Contractor to familiarize itself with visible surface conditions, excluding subsurface and latent conditions, at the site will not be allowed. The Contractor will evaluate and satisfy themselves as to the conditions and limitations under which the Work is to be performed, including, without limitation (1) the location, layout and nature of the Project site and surrounding areas, (2) generally prevailing climatic conditions, (3) anticipated labor supply and costs, and (4) availability and cost of materials, tools and equipment. The Owner assumes no responsibility or liability for the physical condition or safety of the Project site or any improvements located on the Project Site other than unforeseen concealed or latent conditions. The Contractor will be solely responsible for providing a safe place for the performance of the Work. Unless otherwise provided by specific provisions under this agreement, contractor operations and activities related and provided for in this agreement will be under the supervision of a representative from the Burnet County Maintenance who for the purposes of this contract is: Richard Gumbert

Bid, performance, and payment bonds, when required, may be executed on forms furnished by OWNER. A bid bond shall be five percent (5%) of the Contract Amount and Performance and Payment bonds shall be issued in an amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Amount by a solvent surety company authorized to do business in the State of Texas and shall meet any other requirements established by law or by OWNER pursuant to applicable law.

OWNER reserves the right to reject any or all Bids and to waive any minor informality in any Bid or solicitation procedure (a minor informality is one that does not affect the competitiveness of the bidders).

1. Preparation of Bid

Bid shall state location, description of the proposed Work, type of contract (either lump sum, unit price or any combination thereof) and time in which the Work is to be completed.

Each bidder shall prepare Bid in ink or typed on forms furnished by OWNER or as otherwise specified. Blank spaces for each item in Bid form shall be filled. Bidder shall submit a price for each item in Bid. In case of conflict between unit prices and extensions, unit prices shall govern. The Bid shall be executed with complete and correct name of individual, partnership, firm, corporation or other legal entity.

First-time bidders are encouraged to attend the Pre-bid Conference, if one is scheduled, to assure their understanding of OWNER's bidding and contracting requirements. When Pre-bid Conference is mandatory, all bidders are required to attend.

The Owner is a tax-exempt organization as defined by Chapter 11 of the Property Tax Code of Texas. Bid prices shall not include sales tax on materials, supplies, or equipment that are exempt in the performance of the Contract.

Bidder shall be knowledgeable of all Addenda issued and shall acknowledge all Addenda in spaces provided on Bid form. Addenda may be downloaded from https://www.burnetcountytexas.org/page/auditor.bids.

Bid shall include all specified items in this section and be submitted in accordance with Item No. 7 below. Any corrections to Bid shall be initialed by person signing Bid before Bid opening.

Bidder shall secure any required services that are defined as professional services under the Professional Services Procurement Act, Chapter 2254 of the Texas Government Code

Persons desiring further information or interpretation of Bid Documents shall make a written request for such information to the purchasing officer no later than the date specified in the Bid Documents. The OWNER reserves the right to respond to inquiries less than five days before bid due date. Interpretation of Bid Documents will be made by Addendum <u>only</u> and a copy of each Addendum will be posted to https://www.burnetcountytexas.org/page/auditor.bids.

2. Estimates of Quantities (Unit Price Contracts Only)

For Unit priced bids, quantities listed in unit price Bid form are to be considered as approximate and will be used only for comparison of Bids. Payment to CONTRACTOR will be made only for actual quantities of Work performed or materials furnished in accordance with Contract, and it is understood that quantities may be increased or decreased as profiled in General Conditions.

3. Bid Documents and Site (s) of Work

Before submitting a Bid, the bidder shall carefully examine the Bid Documents, site(s) of the proposed Work, soils, and other conditions that may affect the performance of the Work. The bidder shall be satisfied as to character, quality and quantities of Work to be performed and materials to be furnished. Submission of a Bid shall indicate that the bidder has complied with these requirements.

4. Bid Guaranty

All Bids shall be accompanied by a bid guaranty in an amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the total Bid. Bid guaranty shall be made payable to County of Burnet, with Power of Attorney attached, issued by a solvent surety authorized under laws of the State of Texas and acceptable to OWNER.

5. Performance and Payment Bonds

Performance and payment bonds are required if bid exceeds amount shown below, and each shall be issued in an amount equal to the Contract Amount as security for the faithful performance and/or payment of all Contractors' obligations under the Contract Documents. Performance and payment bonds shall be issued by a solvent company authorized to do business in the State of Texas and shall meet any other requirements established by law or by OWNER pursuant to applicable law. The cost of Bond premiums must be included in the bid price.

A payment bond is required for contracts over \$25,000. A performance bond is required for contracts in excess of \$100,000.

6. Consideration of Bid Amount

For purpose of award, after Bids are opened and read aloud, the total amount of a lump sum bid, including accepted Bid alternates, will be considered the amount of Bid. If the Bid is a Unit Price Bid, the Bid Amount will be the total of all extended Unit Price lines. OWNER reserves the right to reject any or all Bids, award by line, and to waive any minor informality in any Bid or solicitation procedure (a minor informality is one that does not affect the competitiveness of the bidders).

7. Submission of Bid

Each Bid, completed and signed by person(s) authorized to bind individual, partnership, firm, corporation or any other legal entity, shall include the following:

- A. One copy of Bid form completed and signed.
- B. Acknowledgment of receipt of Addenda issued in spaces provided in Bid form.
- C. Required bid guaranty.
- D. Forms completed and signed by authorized representative of bidder.
- E. Copy of Articles of Partnership or Incorporation and resolution, or corporate board minutes empowering signatory to bind bidder, attested by an officer of bidder, if required.

- H. Bid shall include all specified items in this section and be placed in envelope, sealed and clearly identified on outside as a Bid to OWNER, with bidder's name and address, and project name and number. Failure to submit Bid in properly marked envelope may subject bidder to disqualification. Bid may be mailed or delivered (in person or any business mail carrier of Bidder's choice) to:

When sent by mail, Federal Express, UPS, Express Mail, or other delivery service, sealed Bid (marked as indicated above) shall be enclosed in an additional envelope clearly identified on outside as a Bid to OWNER with bidder's name and address, Project name, and Bid date and time. It is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to ensure timely delivery of Bid. The bid is timely delivered when it is actually received at the BURNET COUNTY PURCHASING OFFICE on or before the "DUE DATE" as defined in Invitation for Bids. OWNER will not be responsible for failure of service on the part of the U.S. Post Office, courier services, or any other form of delivery service chosen by the Bidder.

8. Withdrawal of Bid

A Bid may be withdrawn by a bidder, provided an authorized individual of the bidder submits a written request to withdraw the Bid prior to the time set for opening the Bids.

9. Rejection of Bids

- A. The following will be cause to reject a Bid:
 - (1) Bids which are not signed.

- (2) Bids which are not accompanied by acceptable bid guaranty with Power of Attorney attached when required.
- (3) More than one Bid for same Work from an individual, firm, partnership or corporation.
- (4) Reason for believing collusion exists among bidders.
- (5) Sworn testimony or discovery in pending litigation with OWNER which discloses misconduct or willful refusal by contractor to comply with subject contract or instructions of OWNER.
- (6) Failure to submit post-Bid information within the allotted time(s).
- (7) Failure to have an authorized agent of the bidder attend the mandatory Pre-Bid Conference, if applicable.
- (8) Bids received from a bidder who has been debarred or suspended by OWNER's Purchasing Officer.
- (9) Bids received from a bidder when bidder or principals are currently debarred or suspended by Federal, State or Local governmental agencies. (Applicable for bid amounts equal to or in excess of \$100,000)
- B. The following may be cause to reject a Bid:
 - (1) Failure to acknowledge receipt of Addenda.
 - (2) Unbalanced unit price Bid. Unbalanced Bid means a Bid that is based on prices which are significantly less than cost for some Bid items and significantly more than cost for others.
 - (3) Poor performance in execution of work under any previous contract.
 - (4) Failure to achieve reasonable progress on existing contracts.
 - (5) Default on previous contracts or failure to execute Contract after award.
 - (6) Evidence of failure to pay Subcontractors, Suppliers or employees.
 - (7) Bids containing omissions, alterations of form, additions, qualifications or conditions not called for by OWNER, or incomplete Bids will be considered in non-compliance and may be rejected. In any case of ambiguity or lack of clarity in the Bid, OWNER reserves right to determine most advantageous Bid or to reject the Bid.
 - (8) Bidder owes delinquent property tax in Burnet County.

10. Award and Execution of Contract

OWNER will process Bids expeditiously. Pursuant 2269 of the Government Code, Burnet County will consider the following for award: the purchase price; the experience and reputation of the vendor and the vendor's goods or services; the quality of the vendor's goods or services; the extent to which the goods or services meet the Burnet County's needs; the vendor's past relationship with the Burnet County or any governmental entity; the impact on the ability of the governmental entity to comply with rules relating to historically underutilized businesses; the total long-term cost to the governmental entity to acquire the vendor's goods or services; safety record, proposed personnel, and any other relevant factor specifically listed in this Bid/Proposal. Award of Contract will be to the lowest, responsible bidder meeting all requirements of the Bid Documents.

Award of Contract will occur within the period identified on the Bid form, unless mutually agreed between the parties. Purchasing Agent shall submit recommendation for award to Commissioners Court for those project awards requiring Commissioners Court action.

County Judge or his/her designee will sign contract after award and submission of required documentation by bidder. Contract will not be binding upon OWNER until both parties have executed it. OWNER will process the Contract expeditiously. However, OWNER will not be liable for any delays prior to the award or execution of Contract.

BURNET COUNTY HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES (HUB) POLICY

I. POLICY STATEMENT

The Burnet County Commissioners Court, being the policy development and budgetary control unit of county government, will strive to ensure that all businesses, regardless of size, economic, social or ethnic status have an equal opportunity to participate in the County's procurement processes. The County is committed to promote full and equal business opportunity for all businesses to supply the goods and services needed to support the mission and operations of county government, and seeks to encourage the use of certified historically underutilized businesses (HUBs) through the use of race, ethnic and gender neutral means. It is the policy of Burnet County to involve certified HUBs to the greatest extent feasible in the County's procurement of goods, equipment, services and construction projects while maintaining competition and quality of work standards. The County affirms the good faith efforts of firms who recognize and practice similar business standards.

II. DEFINITIONS

<u>Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUBs)</u>, also known as a disadvantaged business enterprise (DBE), are generally business enterprises at least 51% of which is owned, and the management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more persons who is/are socially and economically disadvantaged because of his or her identification as a member of certain groups, including women, Black Americans, Mexican Americans and other Americans of Hispanic origin, Asian Americans and American Indians.

<u>Certified HUBs</u> includes business enterprises that meet the definition of a HUB and who meet the certification requirements of certification agencies recognized by Burnet County.

<u>Businesses</u> include firms, corporations, sole proprietorships, vendors, supplier's contractors, subcontractors, professionals and other similar references when referring to a business that provides goods and/or services regardless of the commodity category.

<u>Statutory bid limit</u> refers to the Texas Local Government Code provisions that require competitive bidding for many items valued at greater than \$50,000.

III. POLICY GUIDELINES

- A. The County may recognize other agencies' certification processes recognized by the State of Texas. Burnet County reserves the right to review the certification status of any vendor applying to do business with the County. The review will be accomplished to determine the validity and authenticity of the vendor's certification as a HUB.
- C. The Commissioners Court may establish HUB target goals. Through a systematic approach of soliciting quotes, bids and proposals from certified HUBs and in compliance with applicable state and federal law this policy will strive to meet those goals.
 - 1. Target goals should consider:
 - The availability of HUB firms within the specific category of goods or services to be procured; and
 - b. The diversity of the County's population.
 - 2. The goals should be reviewed and amended periodically.
 - 3. The program may apply to all County procurements including construction and professional services.
 - 4. Particular attention will be given to HUB participation on purchases in excess of the statutory bid limit.
 - Commissioners Court will use good faith efforts to meet the goals of this policy.

- D. Burnet County will actively seek and encourage HUBs to participate in all facets of the procurement process by:
 - 1. Utilizing the State of Texas Historically Underutilized Business vendor database.
 - 2. Advertising bids on the County's website and in the local newspaper.
 - 3. Providing bid notice to minority Chambers of Commerce within Burnet County, if applicable.
- E. As prescribed by law, the purchase of one or more items costing in excess of the statutory bid limit must comply with the competitive bid process. Where possible, those bids will be structured to include and encourage the participation of HUB firms in the procurement process.
- F. A HUB Policy statement shall be included in all specifications. The County will consider the bidder's responsiveness to the HUB Policy in the evaluation of bids and proposals. Failure to demonstrate a good faith effort to comply with the County's HUB policy may result in a bid or proposal being considered non-responsive to specifications.
- G. The Purchasing Department will actively search the State Comptroller's HUB vendor list in the quotation process for purchases under the statutory bid limit.
- H. Nothing in this policy shall be construed to require the County to award a contract other than to the lowest responsive bidder as required by law. This policy is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law.

IV. ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

- A. The Purchasing Office shall serve as the County's HUB Office with responsibility for the implementation, monitoring and general operations of the HUB policy. The Purchasing Director shall serve as the County HUB Officer.
 - The HUB Officer will establish procedures to implement this policy across the full spectrum of the procurement process. The County HUB Office will periodically review with department head and elected officials regarding procurement opportunities.
 - 2. Managing the policy and training buyers and other County personnel in order to meet County goals will be the responsibility of the HUB Office.

- 3. The HUB Office will cooperate with other local government entities to increase HUB participation throughout the county and region. The HUB Office is encouraged to participate in educational and other outreach programs to assist HUB firms.
- 4. Any complaints and/or recommendations regarding the implementation of this policy will be received and reviewed by the HUB Officer. Further, the HUB Office will audit for compliance to the HUB Policy on eligible projects after award, during the performance of the contract and after completion, while also making any recommendations to Commissioner's Court regarding any irregularities or misrepresentations of facts as they relate to compliance with the policy. The HUB Office will review documentation submitted by HUB firms in compliance with this policy.

GENERAL

1.01 SUMMARY

- A. Project Identification:
 - Burnet County Herman Brown Free Library 100 East Washington Street, Burnet, Texas 78611
 - 2. Burnet County Agri-Life Building 607 North Vandeveer Street, Burnet, Texas 78611
- B. Project Summary: Re-roofing the referenced facilities as indicated in the Specifications and Drawings.
- C. Fall Protection and Scaffolding access is to be installed per OSHA requirements.

1.02 SCOPE OF WORK

A. **Bid Item #1:** Burnet County Herman Brown Free Library Roof Replacement

- 1. Upper Roof and Lower Front Entrance Section: The existing roof system consists of a metal decking, 3-inch polyisocyanurate insulation, 1/4-inch gypsum board, and two plies of a modified bitumen installed in hot asphalt. Approximately: 7,500 square feet
- 2. Lower Roof North Section: The existing consists of wood decking, 3-inch polyisocyanurate, and TPO roof membrane. Approximately: 1,000 square feet.
- 3. Lower Roof South Section: The existing consists of wood decking, a ³/₄ built-up roof system, 1/4" inch cover board, and a TPO roof membrane. Approximately: 1,500 square feet.
- 4. The roofing scope of work for the Upper Roof and Lower Front Entrance Section begins with removing the existing modified roof membrane down to the existing insulation board.
- 5. The roofing scope of work for the Lower Roof North & South Sections begins with removing the existing roof systems down to the wood decking.
- 6. At the upper roof drain areas only, remove the roof system completely down the metal decking and install new 2 'x 2' tapered insulation roof drain sumps. The tapered panel system shall be lower than the existing insulation system. Test all drains for water leaks to ensure they are in proper working condition before the project. Notify the owner of any plumbing-related issues.
- 7. The contractor shall not remove more roofing than can be replaced daily or that can be made watertight by each day's end. The scope of work encompasses the complete removal of all vertical base flashings and edge metal at the perimeter of the building. Remove all related sheet metal components. Debris is to be disposed of at a designated dumping facility. Perform daily clean-up to collect all wrappings, empty containers, paper, and other debris from the project site. Upon completion, all debris must be disposed of in a legally acceptable manner.
- 8. At the Upper Roof and Lower Front Entrance Section, mechanically fasten or adhere a new 1.5-inch polyisocyanurate insulation board to the existing 3-inch polyisocyanurate. Stagger and offset all joints.

- 9. At the Lower Roof Areas (North and South), mechanically fasten a two-layer 2.2" polyisocyanurate insulation board into the existing wood decking. Stagger and offset all joints.
- 10. Insulation Board Fastening pattern is as follows for 4x8 boards: Zone 1 (Field) 12 per, Zone 2 (Perimeter) 18 per, Zone 3 (Corners) 32 per.
- 11. Adhere new 1/2" tapered slope crickets between all existing roof drains and behind HVAC units to direct water flow. Roof crickets are to connect to the top of the sump and not the bottom of the new drain sump.
- 12. At all roof areas, adhere a 1/2" primed gypsum roof cover board to the insulation system in accordance with the roof system manufacturer's project-specific wind uplift calculations. Stagger and offset all joints. Cover Board Ribbon Pattern is as follows 3/4" wide ribbons, Zone 1: (Field) 12 inches, Zone 2: (Perimeter) 6-inches, Zone 3: (Corners) 4 inches
- 13. At all roof areas, apply a base ply of smooth-surfaced Basis of Design: ASTM 6163 Type III modified bitumen to the prepared substrate, in shingled fashion, starting at the drains and working outward to the high points of the tapered insulation system.
- 14. Apply a cap sheet ply of reflective mineral-surfaced, Basis of Design: ASTM 6163 Type III Stressply IV Plus UV Mineral or pre-approved equal modified bitumen to the prepared substrate, in shingled fashion, starting at the drains and working outward to the high points of the tapered insulation system. All exposed corners shall be truncated to create a rounded edge.
- 15. Immediately broadcast minerals into the bleedout of the side and end-laps of the cap sheet ply to achieve a monolithic coverage of roofing granules.
- 16. Install new wood blocking as needed to accommodate the change in height at all edge details.
- 17. All bid items must include raising the existing gas lines to a minimum of 12 inches above the roof surface. Install on new Dura-Block pipe supports every 10' with slip pads installed under them. The gas lines are to be cleaned, primed, and painted Rust-Go Yellow.
- 18. The existing condensate lines are to be removed/adjusted and raised to meet the new roof height. Any damage to existing lines is to be replaced with new lines. Install on new Dura-Block pipe supports every 10' with slip pads installed under them.
- 19. Install the existing electrical panel on the new equipment rails. Curbs to be a minimum of 12 inches above the new roof surface
- 20. Install new stainless steel pipe boxes per detail at electrical line entry points. Pitch pans will be filled with pourable sealer prior to the installation of the cap. Stainless steel soldered pipe boxes to have removable hoods.
- 21. Raise all existing mini-split, exhaust fans, and plumbing vents to be a minimum of 8 inches above the new roof surface.
- 22. Install new stainless steel overflow scuppers.
- 23. Install a new 2x-treated wood blocking at the parapet wall and at the perimeter edges to meet the roof height. Blocking is to be kiln-dried and fastened with stainless steel fasteners per FM Global guidelines. At concrete areas, secure edge wood blocking with ½" diameter anchor bolts. Install ice and water shield over the blocking at the parapet wall.
- 24. At all parapet walls, install 24-gauge new prefinished standing seam coping cap.
- 25. Install new 24-gauge pre-finished drip edge, gutter, and downspout system.
- 26. All existing vent-through roof pipes are to have new lead boots installed per details.
- 27. Remove the existing roof ladder and give it to the county for reuse. Install a new Cotterman fixed roof ladder between the upper and lower roof areas for county use. Install ½" thick rubber walk pads at new roof ladder landing areas.

- 28. The existing steel roof drain clamping rings and strainers are to be primed with rust-go primer and painted Rust-Oleum red. Any existing damaged rings or strainers are to be replaced with new. Install all new stainless steel all threads, stainless steel nuts, and washers.
- 29. Install new wood expansion joints at the lower roof area. The expansion joint is to have a through-wall scupper installed to allow for drainage.
- 30. Install new 24-gauge pre-finished metal wall panels between the upper and lower roof areas for a water-tight system. Basis of Design: Imetco Perm-Wall or pre-approved equal.
- 31. All HVAC and electrical systems are not to be damaged. Any damaged components are to be replaced by the roofing contractor.
- 32. Materials are to be secured on the project site by fencing.

Adhere insulation adhesive ³/₄" wide ribbons 4'x4', 1/2" Dens-Deck Prime gypsum roof cover board to the insulation system in accordance with the roof system manufacturer's project-specific wind uplift calculation. Stagger and offset all joints. Cover Board Ribbon Pattern is as follows ³/₄" wide ribbons, Zone 1: (Field) 12 inches, Zone 2: (Perimeter) 6 inches, Zone 3.
 - 8. At all roof areas, apply a base ply of smooth-surfaced Basis of Design: ASTM 6163 Type III modified bitumen to the prepared substrate, in shingled fashion, starting at the drains and working outward to the high points of the tapered insulation system.

- 9. Apply a cap sheet ply of reflective mineral-surfaced, Basis of Design: ASTM 6163 Type III Stressply IV Plus UV Mineral or pre-approved equal modified bitumen to the prepared substrate, in shingled fashion, starting at the drains and working outward to the high points of the tapered insulation system. All exposed corners shall be truncated to create a rounded edge.
- 10. Immediately broadcast minerals into the hot bitumen bleedout of the side and end-laps of the cap sheet ply to achieve a monolithic coverage of roofing granules.
- 11. Install a new 24-gauge pre-finished, drip edge, gutter, and downspout system around the perimeter of the roof system per the roof manufacturer's drawings—downspouts to be install every 20 on center.
- 12. Raise existing mechanical units to be 12 inches above the new roof height using new curb extensions.
- 13. Install new stainless steel pipe boxes per detail at condensate line entry points. Pitch pans will be filled with pourable sealer prior to the installation of the cap. Stainless steel soldered pipe boxes to have removable hoods.
- 14. All existing vent-through roof pipes are to have new lead boots installed per details.

- 3. Install all existing min-spilt/condensers currently blocking on new equipment rails.
- 4. Install new 16-gauge clips into the purlins every 5 foot on center.
- 5. Install new shed ridge metal detail with foam head closures per the manufacturer's shop drawings.
- 6. Install a new 24-gauge pre-finished standing seam roof system per the manufacturer's shop drawings. Basis of Design: Imetco Zib-Rib Panel
- 7. Install new roof curb flashing according to the manufacturer's specifications.
- 8. Install new S-5 Clips and carbon steel bar galvanized metal grating to serve as a walkway to all HVAC units and around each unit 360 degrees. Grating to be 24 inches minimum in width. Install approximately 400 linear feet of grading for walkway access.

Bid Item #4: Burnet Agri-Life - Office Area – R-Panel

Office Area R-Panel

- 1. The scope of work for the project consists of installing a new CPR synthetic liquid rubber elastomeric coating on the existing metal roof system.
- 2. All dirt, debris, oils and contaminants that can interfere with adhesion of coatings must be removed by the most effective method possible. High-pressure water washing (2000 psi minimum) is the preferred method simple green cleaner.
- 3. Rust must be removed using the most rigorous method suitable for each particular job. After rust or oxidation has been removed, rusted surfaces should be primed with Metal Roof Primer immediately after cleaning to prevent rust or oxidation from reoccurring. Metal Roof Primer should be applied at the rate of 1/4 gallon per 100 sq. ft. (0.11 l/m2) over the rusted areas.
- 4. Make sure all fasteners are properly tightened and neoprene washers are in place. Replace all loose and rusted fasteners at panel overlaps with new oversized fasteners as necessary. Missing fasteners must be replaced. Create a watertight seal on all fastener heads by applying a heavy dab of polyurethane caulk to the tops of all fastener head.
- 5. Install new deck-tie pipe boots on all pipe penetrations.
- 6. Basis of Design: CPR Elastomeric Coating or pre-approved equal.
- 7. The CPR system can be applied at temperatures of 40 degrees F and rising.
- 8. CPR Brush grade seam sealer at ridge cap and vertical seams panel seams at a rate of 0.67 gallons per 100 square feet. May be applied with a brush or heavy nap roller.
- 9. Apply polyester fabric at large gap areas over ½" inch.
- 10. Apply the CPR Base Coat at a coverage rate of 1.5 gal./100 ft.2 (0.61 l/m2) on roof surface(s) and 0.5 gal/100 ft.
- 11. After field seam application and base coat application have been completed and allowed to dry, apply CPR White Coating in a uniform manner at a minimum application rate of 1.5 gallons per 100 ft.2.
- 12. The contractor is to provide a 2-year workmanship warranty.
- 13. Roof Manufacturer to provide a 10-year water-tight warranty.
- 14. Please refer to the manufacturer's data sheets and application instructions.

A. Roof Manufacturers Field Representation:

- a. Manufacturer's Field Representative: An authorized, full-time employee of the roof system manufacturer shall be assigned to the project to conduct field observations during the installation phase.
- b. Regularly scheduled site observations shall be required by the manufacturer's field representative a minimum of three (3) days per week during the roofing installation period; exceptions being made for inclement weather, holidays, etc.
- c. Observation reports shall include the following:
 - i. Written report/documentation of the installation progress at the time of the site visit to be delivered to the owner once per week during the duration of the project
 - ii. This report shall include documentation of any issues/question and resolution/
 - iii. This report shall include record of directives given to the roofing contractor.

- iv. Digital photographic documentation of the roofing progress; including documentation of specific issues and areas of concern.
- v. Each report shall contain project name, architect's project number, and date/time/duration of site visit.
- d. In addition to the progress observations, the manufacturer's representative must:
 - i. Attend the roofing trade start-up meeting.
 - ii. Inspect and approve the roof substrate/deck prior to the start of roofing work.
- e. All observation reports shall be kept current and shall be delivered electronically to the owner and contractor within five (5) calendar days after the observation. Progress payments for roofing work may be withheld if observation report submissions are not current.
- f. After completion of all roofing work, and prior to acceptance of the roofing installation, the manufacturer's representative shall conduct an observation to document all roofing work to be corrected as a condition of acceptance.
 - i. Each item requiring corrective work shall be identified (including specific location) and required corrective action shall be noted.
 - ii. The final observation report must be produced in writing with photographic back-up. Marking corrective items on the roof alone shall not be acceptable.
- B. Existing site conditions and restrictions: The building may be occupied at the time of construction and care must be taken not to disturb normal operations of the occupants. A man must be staged on ground at all times.
- C. Roof Material Edge Protection: Precaution shall be taken to ensure that no materials, debris or tools are able to fall from the roof at any point.
- D. Permits: Apply for, obtain, and pay for permits required to perform the work. Submit copies to Owner.
- E. Codes: Comply with applicable codes and regulations of authorities having jurisdiction. Submit copies of inspection reports, notices and similar communications to Owner.
- F. Dimensions: Verify dimensions and quantities indicated in scope of work with field dimensions before fabrication or ordering of materials.
- G. Existing Conditions: Notify owner's representative or consultant of existing conditions differ from those indicated in the scope of work. Do not remove or alter structural components without prior written approval.
- H. Definition for terms used in the Specifications:
 - a. Provide: Furnish and install, complete with all necessary accessories, ready for intended use. Pay for all related costs.
 - b. Intent: Specifications are intended to provide the basis for proper completion of the work suitable for the intended use of the Owner. Anything not expressly set forth but which is reasonably implied or necessary for the proper performance of the project shall be included.
 - c. Writing Style: Specifications are written in the imperative mode. Except where specifically intended otherwise, the subject of all imperative statements is the Contractor. For example, "Provide tile" means Contractor shall provide tile.
